ORCO Sportsman's Association, Inc. INDOOR RANGE RULES

- 1. WHEN HANDLING ANY FIREARM IN THE CLUBHOUSE AND RANGES, ALWAYS FOLLOW THE UNIVERSAL FUNDAMENTAL GUN SAFETY RULES:
 - a. <u>ALWAYS</u> TREAT EVERY FIREARM AS IF IT IS LOADED
 - b. <u>ALWAYS KEEP THE GUN POINTED IN A SAFE DIRECTION</u>
 - c. <u>ALWAYS</u> KEEP YOUR FINGER OFF THE TRIGGER UNTIL YOUR EYES ARE ON THE SIGHTS, THE SIGHTS ARE ON THE TARGET, AND YOU ARE READY TO SHOOT DOWNRANGE
 - d. <u>ALWAYS</u> KEEP THE GUN UNLOADED UNTIL READY FOR USE
 - e. BE AWARE OF YOUR TARGET AND WHAT IS BEHIND IT BEFORE YOU FIRE
- 2. HANDLING OF FIREARMS IN THE DUTY/READY ROOM, WHEN CASING/UNCASING, HOLSTERING/UNHOLSTERING WILL BE DONE NEXT TO AND FACING THE EAST BLOCK WALL. IF FIREARM IS NOT IMMEDIATELY SECURED, CASED OR HOLSTERED IT WILL BE EQUIPPED WITH EMPTY CHAMBER INDICATOR AND MAGAZINE REMOVED.
- 3. EYE AND EAR PROTECTION MUST BE WORN IN THE RANGE BY ALL SHOOTERS AND SPECTATORS.
- 4. ONLY PAPER OR CARDBOARD TARGETS MAY BE USED.
- 5. TARGETS ARE TO BE PLACED SO THE ROUNDS IMPACT THE BACKSTOP. THEY WILL BE POSITIONED AND ONLY FIRED UPON FROM THE SAME SHOOTING LANE. NO CROSS LANE SHOOTING.
- 6. WHILE ON THE RANGE, FIREARMS ARE TO BE UNCASED AND CASED IN THE SHOOTING BOOTHS.
- 7. NO ONE IS TO GO DOWNRANGE UNTIL THEY AND ALL OTHER SHOOTERS ACKNOWLEDGE THAT THE LINE IS SAFE, AND NO HANDLING OF FIREARMS. AT THAT TIME THE SAFETY STROBE LIGHT SHALL BE TURNED ON.
- 8. DO NOT DISTURB A SHOOTER ON THE FIRING LINE EXCEPT FOR A SAFETY REASON.
- 9. UNLESS SECURED IN A HOLSTER, ALL FIREARMS ARE TO BE UNLOADED, WITH THE ACTIONS OPEN, MAGAZINES REMOVED AND EMPTY CHAMBER INDICATORS INSERTED IN PLACE, WHEN SOMEONE IS DOWNRANGE.
- 10. AFTER CHECKING THAT ALL HAVE RETURNED FROM DOWNRANGE, ANNOUNCE "NO ONE IS DOWNRANGE", THEN THE SAFETY LIGHT MAY BE TURNED OFF.

- 11. NO SHOOTING FROM BEHIND OR IN FRONT OF THE SHOOTING BOOTHS AT ANY TIME.
- 12. NO FAST/QUICK DRAW FROM A HOLSTER OR UN-AIMED FIRING TYPE OF SHOOTING.
- 13. AT NO TIME SHALL CROSS DRAW, SMALL OF BACK, OR SHOULDER HOLSTERS BE USED ON THE RANGE.
- 14. NO TEAR GAS, MACE, PEPPER SPRAY OR OTHER IRRITANTS ARE TO BE USED ON ORCO RANGES.
- 15. ONLY RIFLES CHAMBERED IN .22 RIMFIRE SHORT, LONG OR LONG RIFLE ARE ALLOWED ON THE INDOOR RANGE.
- 16. NO USE OF SHOTGUNS, MUZZLELOADERS, CAP & BALL, ETC. NO BLACKPOWDER.
- 17. NO CENTER-FIRE RIFLES, CARBINES, OR HANDGUNS CAPABLE OF FIRING RIFLE AMMUNITION EXAMPLES: XP-100, RUGER BLACKHAWK 30 CARBINE, T/C CONTENDER, ETC.
- 18. INDOOR CENTER-FIRE HANDGUN AMMUNITION MUST MEET TWO REQUIREMENTS:
 - a. <u>FIRST</u>, ALL BULLETS MUST BE EITHER LEAD ALLOY OR IF JACKETED MUST HAVE A LEAD CORE. JACKETED AMMO IS ALLOWED IN ALL CALIBERS, IT MAY BE EITHER FULL METAL JACKET (FMJ) OR JACKETED SOFT/HOLLOW POINT (JSP/JHP), BUT MUST HAVE A LEAD CORE AND A COPPER JACKET. NO STEEL CORE OR STEEL JACKETED OR TRACER AMMO IS ALLOWED.
 - b. <u>SECOND.</u> MUZZLE VELOCITY MUST BE BELOW <u>1150 FPS</u>. THIS MEANS NO MAGNUM AMMO MAY BE USED, NOR ANY OF THE ULTRA-HIGH VELOCITY LOADINGS FOR THE STANDARD CALIBERS. THIS LATTER RESTRICTION REFERS TO AMMO FROM CORBON, TRITON, GLASER, MAGSAFE, ETC.
- 19. WHEN TESTING A SEMI-AUTO FIREARM THAT WAS JUST REPAIRED, START WITH SINGLE SHOT ONLY. IF USING A RANSOM REST, USE SINGLE SHOT ONLY WHEN TESTING A SEMI-AUTO.
- 20. DRY FIRING FOLLOW THE SAME RULES AS FOR LIVE FIRE.
- 21. THE ORCO SPORTSMAN'S ASSOCIATION, INC. IS A SMOKE FREE ENVIRONMENT. THEREFORE, THERE IS NO SMOKING ON THE INDOOR RANGE OR IN THE CLUBHOUSE BUILDING.
